CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, carried by the Marshal of Convocation, was presented to Saint Mary's University in 1980. It symbolizes the University's authority to grant degrees and is a gift from Maritime Command in honour of alumni killed in both world wars. The mace also recognizes serving members of the Canadian Armed Forces who have been students at Saint Mary's.

The mace is made of oak with a cast brass crown and brass plates carrying traditional ceremonial engravings; the plates represent the contributions to Saint Mary's by the Jesuit Fathers, the Christian Brothers of Ireland, the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Halifax-Yarmouth, the LaSalle Christian Brothers, the Lay Teachers, and the Armed Forces.

Flags on the Stage

Included in the University's permanent collection of flags is one from the International Year of the Disabled signifying the University's commitment to people with disabilities. The Mi'kmaq flag is an important part of this collection in recognition of their First Nation's Status. The University's Bicentennial flag was made a part of our permanent collection in 2002.

Professor Emerita

Dr. Martha MacDonald

Dr. MacDonald, a native Haligonian, joined Saint Mary's in 1982, after one year at Mount Saint Vincent University and five years as a research associate at the Institute of Public Affairs, Dalhousie. Her PhD is from Boston College. She served as Chair of the Economics Department from 2007-2012, shepherding the Master of Applied Economics to approval. She served a term on the Board of Governors, and many years on the Executive Committee, Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research.

Dr. MacDonald was committed to interdisciplinary programs at Saint Mary's. She was one of the founders of the Gorsebrook Research Institute for Atlantic Canada Studies, serving on the board for many years (including as Chair) and then as Director. She also helped develop the undergraduate and graduate women's studies programs at Saint Mary's, serving as coordinator of each.



Her interdisciplinary bent is reflected in her research record, which includes projects related to the fishery and coastal communities, the social economy, precarious work, unemployment, and recently a series of projects related to aging. Several were international collaborations. Her research has a strong policy focus, which carried over to her teaching. She developed a graduate course on the Economics of Social Policy and one of the first courses on Women and the Economy offered in a Canadian economics department.

She was a leader in the development of feminist economics, serving as President of the International Association for Feminist Economics in 2007 and working with the journal Feminist Economics since its inception in 1995. She has published in diverse journals including Feminist Economics, Canadian Public Policy, World Development, Canadian Journal of Economics, Studies in Political Economy, Journal of Canadian Studies, and the Review of income and Wealth.

Honorary Degree Recipient

Michael H. McCain, Doctor of Commerce, honoris causa

Michael H. McCain is President and Chief Executive Officer of Maple Leaf Foods, one of Canada's flagship food companies, with sales of \$4.3 billion and employing approximately 13,500 people in Canada and the United States.

Mr. McCain has devoted his career to the food industry, starting at McCain Foods in the late 1970s, where he held a variety of roles, including president and chief executive officer of McCain Foods USA. He joined Maple Leaf Foods in 1995. Since then, he has been instrumental in establishing Maple Leaf as a strong and sustainable, values-based company with leading brands and market shares across its businesses and a bold vision for the future.



Mr. McCain and his team are deeply committed to being the global leader in sustainable proteins, reflected in ambitious goals in the advancement of nutrition, reducing antibiotic use in livestock, animal care, environmental sustainability, and enhancing food security nationally and globally. Mr. McCain is a director of McCain Capital and Maple Leaf Foods. He is a member of the Richard Ivey School of Busines Advisory Board, the Business Council of Canada, and the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health Foundation. He is also the honorary chairman of the Maple Leaf Centre for Action on Food Security.

Born in Florenceville, New Brunswick, Michael attended Mount Allison University and received an Honours Business Administration degree from the University of Western Ontario. He also holds honorary degrees from Brock University, Carleton University and Guelph University. He is devoted to his five children and family, and lives in Toronto.

Valedictorians

Amy E. Heim

Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research

Amy graduates with a Doctor of Philosophy in Applied Science. Originally from Rochester, New York, she received a Bachelor of Science from Allegheny College in 2008 and a Master of Applied Science from Saint Mary's in 2013. She currently works with Dr. Tony Charles, examining hazards faced by Nova Scotian coastal communities.

Amy's research has focused on the contribution of vegetation to green infrastructure. Her work examines how biodiversity, and in turn



ecosystem services, can be increased and maintained for an extended period. Using green roofs as a study system provided Amy with a unique opportunity to test ecological theory while providing insights that can be applied to green roof construction.

Amy has received numerous academic and research awards, including the Vanier Canada Graduate Scholarship, and has published 15 peer-reviewed journal articles and a book chapter. She was actively involved in campus life, founding the graduate students' society, volunteering as herbarium curator, organizing a research competition and serving on ten university committees. For her dedication to Saint Mary's University, she earned the Student Leadership Recognition Award.

She would like to thank those who assisted her and made her time at Saint Mary's such a rewarding experience, particularly the faculty and staff from the departments of biology and environmental science.

Sobey School of Business



Hannah was born and raised in Saint John, New Brunswick. The small-town vibe and friendly neighbors will always hold a special place in her heart, while she now calls Halifax home.

During her four years at the Sobey School of Business, Hannah studied accounting and will be pursuing a career as an Accountant with Baker Tilly, an Accounting Firm in Dartmouth, NS beginning in October 2021. She will continue to pursue a Chartered Professional Accountant (CPA) designation. She graduates today *summa cum laude*.

Hannah's time at Saint Mary's was most notably spent with Enactus Saint Mary's, a student-led social enterprise organization. Makadunyiswe Doublejoy Ngulube came to Saint Mary's from Bulawayo, Zimbabwe. She graduates today with a Bachelor of Science, Honours in Environmental Science, Co-operative Education.

Maka's research focuses on the Wave Dissipation Potential of Spartina alterniflora in the Bay of Fundy, addressing the knowledge gap in studies on coastal protection and nature-based adaptation to climate change. She has received top awards at the Science Atlantic Environment Conference and the Atlantic Canada Coastal Estuarine Science Society Conference for her work. Maka plans to specialise in her field and has begun her Master in Applied Science at Saint Mary's this fall.

Maka was actively involved on campus with the SMU Environmental Society and African Society, as well as organizing Welcome Weeks events. She served as the



Delegates Director for the first ever TEDxSaintMarysU event and has facilitated multiple sessions at various leadership conferences. She has also held roles as a teaching assistant and research technician. In 2020, she was awarded the Student Leadership Recognition Award for demonstrating leadership within and beyond the classroom.

She is member of the Global Shapers Halifax Hub, which is comprised of young people who tackle various world issues with expertise from their respective disciplines. Remotely, she has worked on projects to raise local biodiversity awareness through Green Hut Initiative, a non-profit organization in Zimbabwe.






