Admission Requirements per Faculty

Please note that the minimum average required for admission is 70% with no mark less than 60% in the appropriate courses listed below, depending on the program.

Arts and Environmental Studies: English 121 or 122; four additional academic Grade 12 courses

Commerce (Business): English 121 or 122; Foundations of Mathematics 12; three additional academic Grade 12 courses

Science: English 121 or 122; Pre-Calculus 12B; two academic 12 Science courses; one additional academic Grade 12 course

Engineering (Diploma): English 121 or 122; Pre-Calculus 12B; Physics 12, Chemistry 12; one additional academic Grade 12 course
